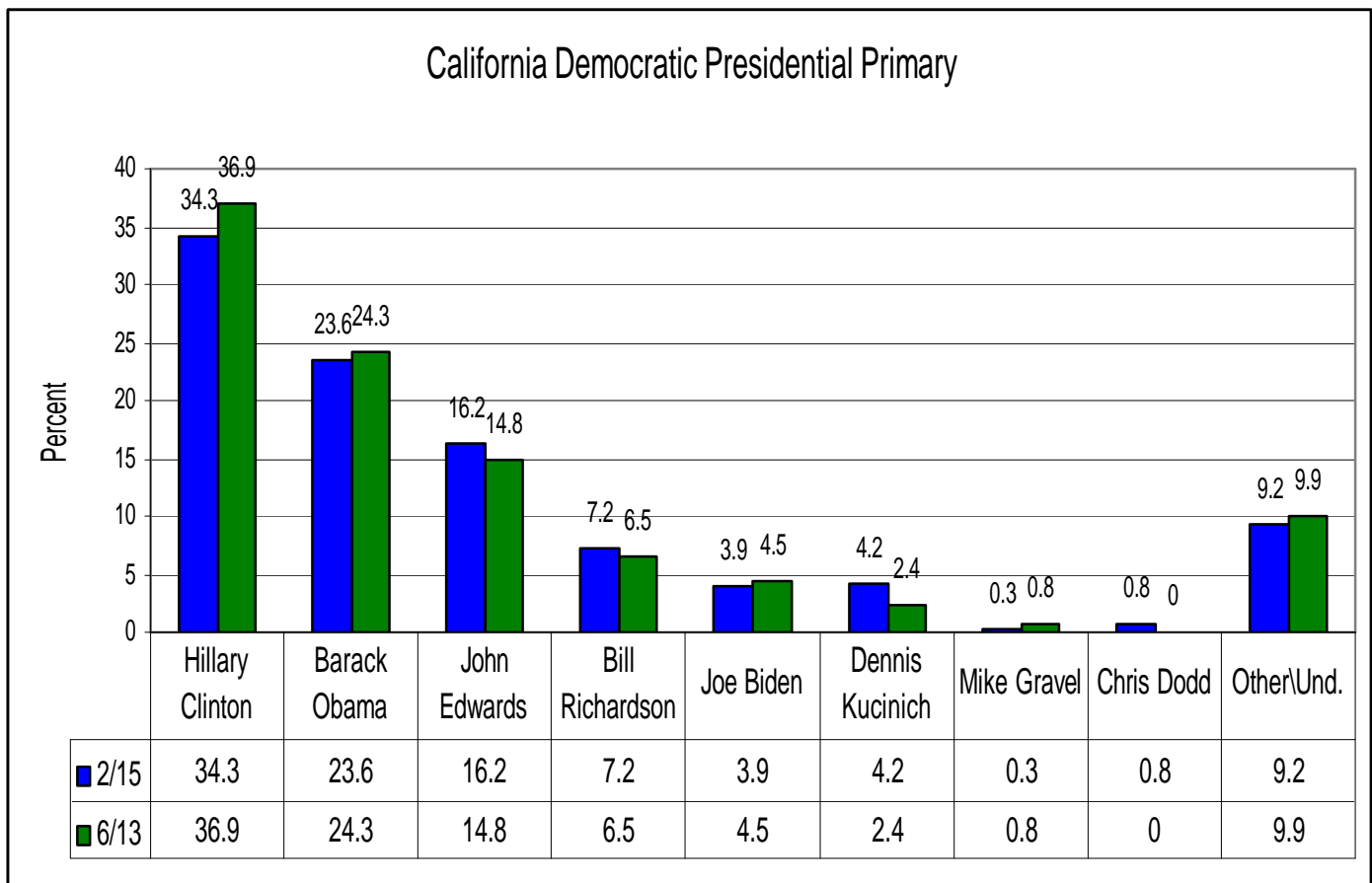

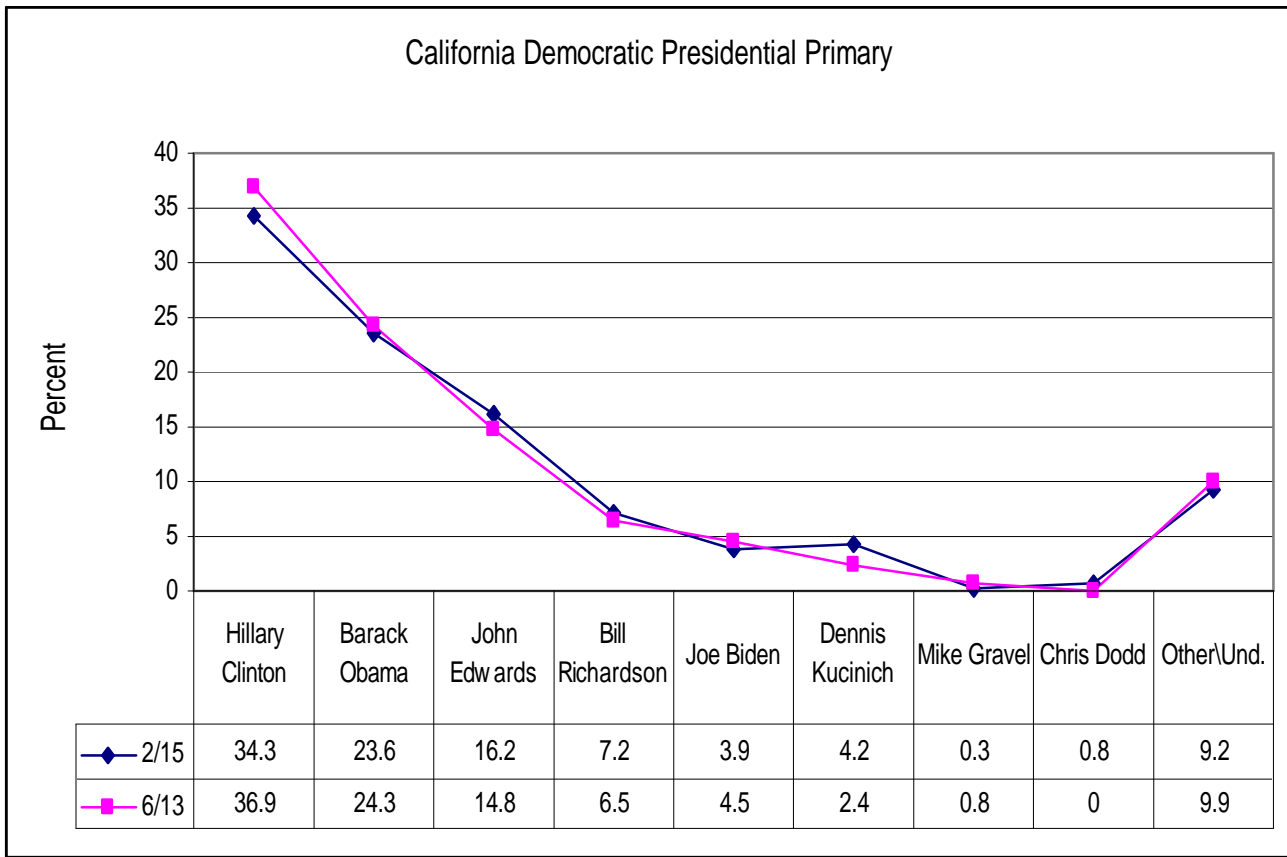

San Diego – A poll released today by Datamar Inc., shows that U.S. Senator from New York, Hillary Clinton, 36.9%, is still leading in the California Presidential primary. U.S. Senator from Illinois, Barack Obama, is a distant second with 24.3%, and former U.S. Senator from North Carolina, John Edwards, 14.8%, is a distant third. Findings are based on a June 6 – 11, 2007 survey of California voters using Datamar’s proprietary targeted-registration-based-sampling (TRBS)* method.

Methodology: Findings are based on June 6 – 11, 2007 survey of California voters. The survey was conducted using an automated telephone dialer and the voice of a professional announcer. The targeted-registration-based-sampling (TRBS)* selection criteria were based on election cycles and other voter factors in California. Datamar proprietary algorithms were used to generate random samples from the target group for calling.

Where necessary, responses were weighted according to age, gender, and political party.

The margin of error for the total sample is +/- 4.4 percent at the 95 percent confidence level.
