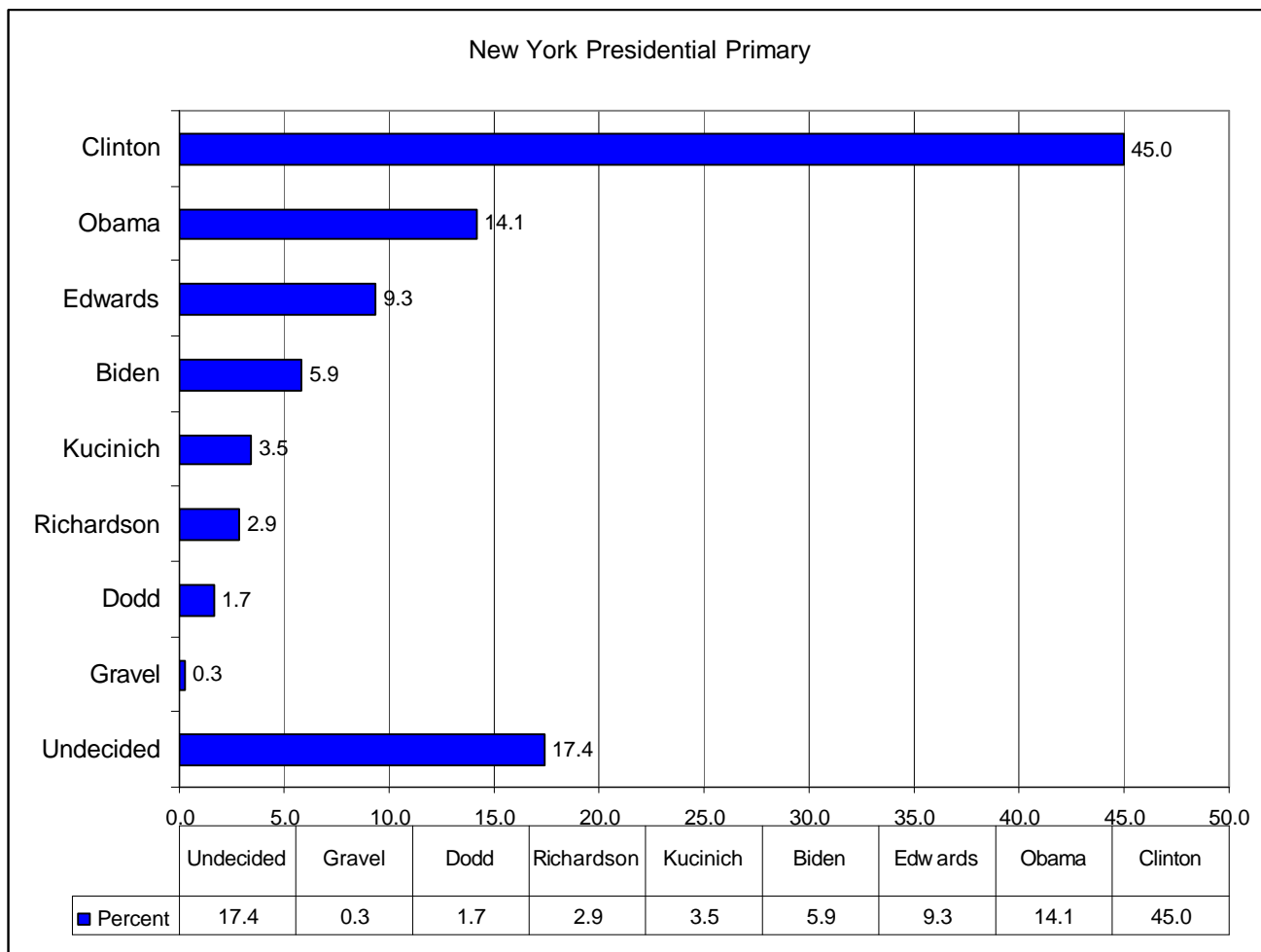

San Diego – A poll released today by Datamar Inc., shows that U.S. Senator from New York, Hillary Clinton, 45.0%, is the leader in the New York presidential primary. U.S. Senator from Illinois, Barack Obama, is a distant second with 14.1 %, and former U.S. Senator from North Carolina, John Edwards, 9.3%, is a distant third. Findings are based on a November 1-4, 2007 survey of New York voters.

Methodology: Findings are based on November 1- 4, 2007 survey of New York voters. The survey was conducted using an automated telephone dialer using the voice of a professional announcer and online where respondents used a login to access the survey.

The targeted-registration-based-sampling (TRBS)* selection criteria were based on election cycles and other voter factors in New York. Datamar proprietary algorithms were used to generate random samples from the target group for calling.

Where necessary, responses were weighted according to age, gender, and political party.

The margin of error for the total sample is +/- 3.8 percent at the 95 percent confidence level.

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The three top vote-getters in the New York Democratic Presidential Primary survey, U.S. Senator from New York, Hillary Clinton, former U.S. Senator from North Carolina, John Edwards, and U.S. Senator from Illinois, Barack Obama are featured in our descriptions to give readers an idea of how the candidates are performing from the perspective of New York voters.

Rather than grouping the candidates that at this time have smaller percentages of support to the category of “others”, we have included their results with that of the “first tier” candidates. This will allow supporters of all candidates to have access to the information and also be able to do their own analysis of the data.
