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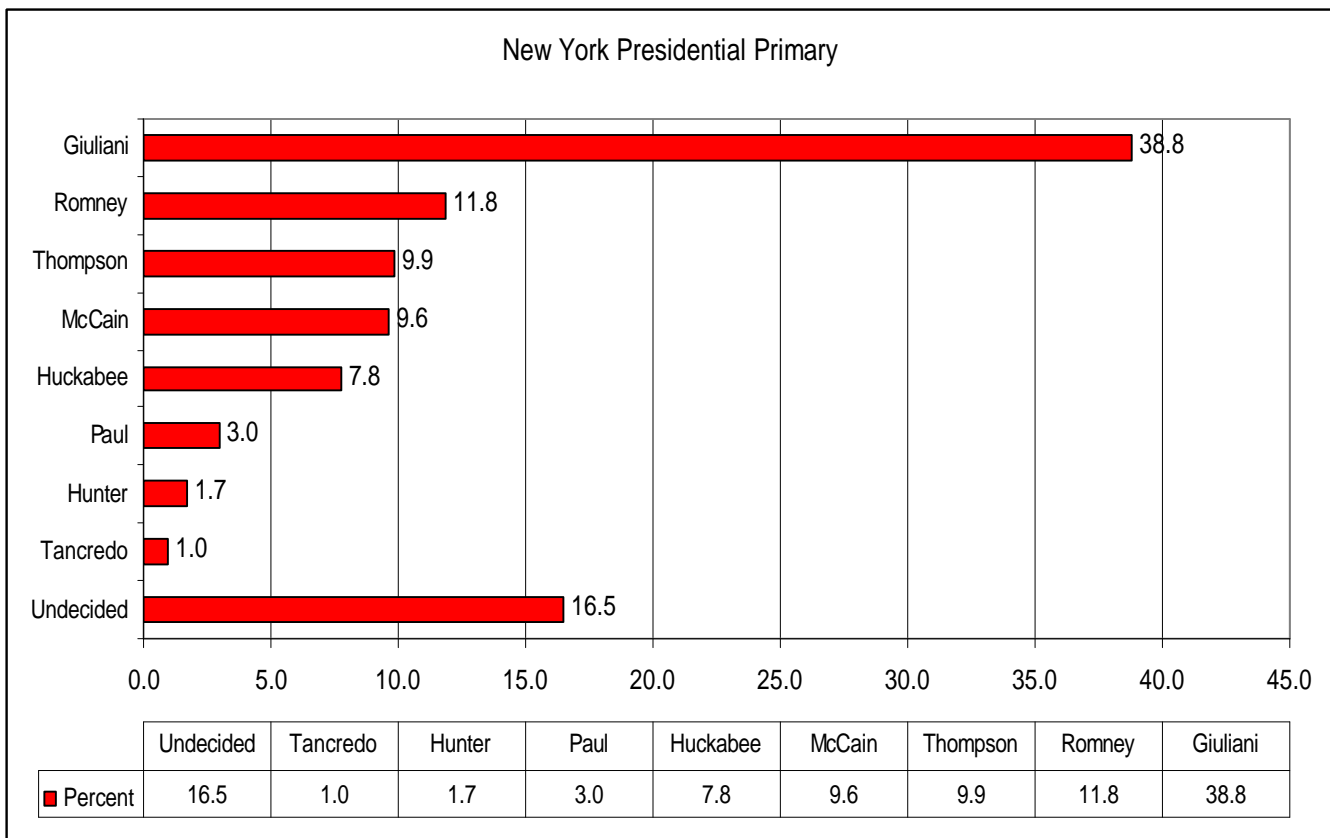

San Diego – A poll released today by Datamar Inc., shows Former New York Mayor Rudy Giuliani in the lead with 38.8%, in the New York presidential primary. Former Governor of Massachusetts, Mitt Romney, is in second place with 11.8%. Former U.S. Senator from Tennessee, Fred Thompson, jumps to third place with 9.9% and U.S. Senator from Arizona, John McCain is fourth with 9.6%. Findings are based on a November 1 - 5, 2007, survey of New York voters.

Methodology: Findings are based on November 1 – 5, 2007 survey of New York voters. The survey was conducted using an automated telephone dialer using the voice of a professional announcer and online where respondents used a login to access the survey.

The targeted-registration-based-sampling (TRBS)* selection criteria were based on election cycles and other voter factors in New York. Datamar proprietary algorithms were used to generate random samples from the target group for calling.

The margin of error for the total sample is +/- 3.7 percent at the 95 percent confidence level.

Where necessary, responses were weighted according to age, gender, and political party.

The four top vote-getters in the New York Republican Presidential Primary survey, Former New York Mayor Rudy Giuliani, Former Governor of Massachusetts, Mitt Romney, Former U.S. Senator from Tennessee, Fred Thompson, and U.S. Senator from Arizona, John McCain are featured in our top lines section to give readers an idea of how the candidates are performing from the perspective of New York voters. While we highlighted the candidates with the largest percentages in each category, in many cases, due to the margin of error, 3.7%, all of the other candidates are virtually tied.

Rather than grouping the candidates that at this time have smaller percentages of support to the category of “others”, we have included their results with that of the “first tier” candidates. This will allow supporters of all candidates to have access to the information and also be able to do their own analysis of the data.

Romney support is mostly among males, 63.1%, Thompson also has more support among males, 67.1%, than among females, 32.9%. McCain, on the other hand, has 58.8% support among females and Giuliani also has more support among females, 52.7% than among males, 47.3%.

Giuliani gets his strongest support, 40%, from the 35-49 age group. McCain is strongest, 41.2%, in the 50-64 age category. Thompson also draws his largest support from the 50-64 age group. Romney's largest group of supporters, 42.9%, is in the 65 and older group.
