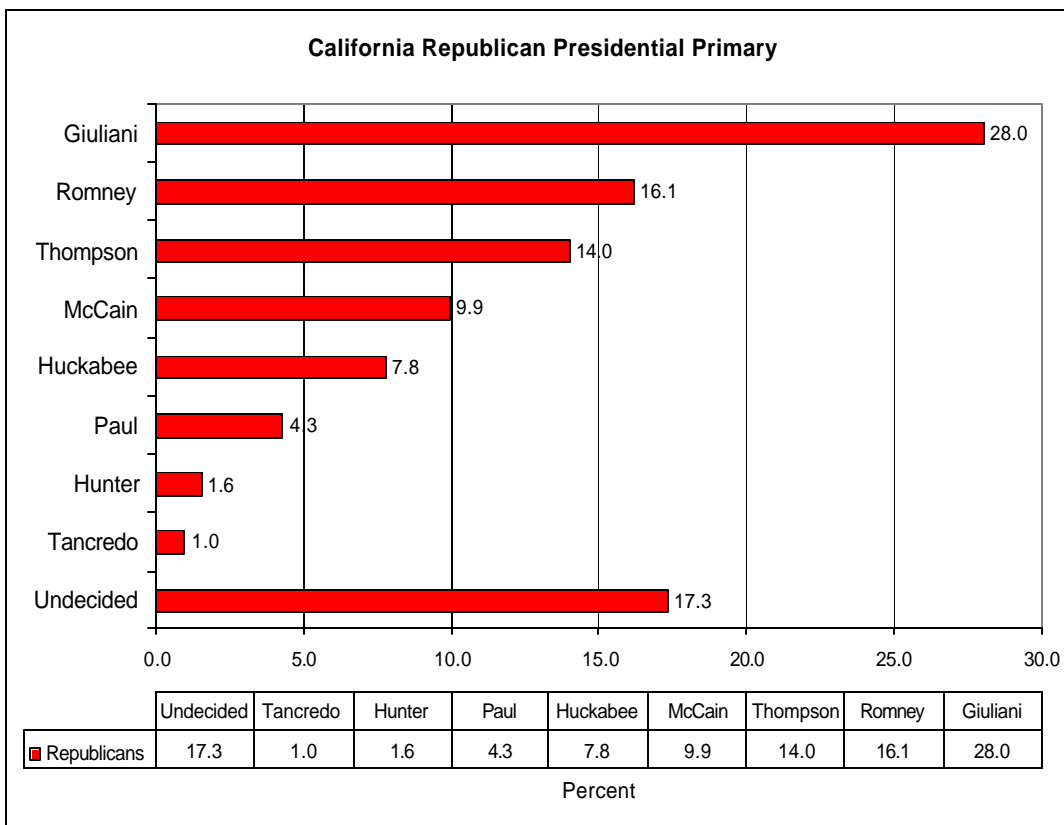

San Diego – A poll released today by Datamar Inc., shows Former Mayor of New York, Rudy Giuliani, is in first place with 28%. Former Governor from Massachusetts, Mitt Romney is in second place with 16.1%, in the California Presidential primary. Former U.S. Senator from Tennessee, Fred Thompson is in third place with 14%; and U.S. Senator from Arizona, John McCain is fourth with 9.9%. Findings are based on a November 23 - 27, 2007 survey of California voters using Datamar’s proprietary targeted-registration-based-sampling (TRBS)* method.





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Methodology: Findings are based on November 23 - 27, 2007 survey of California voters. The survey was conducted using an automated telephone dialer and the voice of a professional announcer.

The targeted-registration-based-sampling (TRBS)* selection criteria were based on election cycles and other voter factors in California. Datamar proprietary algorithms were used to generate random samples from the target group for calling.

The margin of error for the total sample is +/- 4.3 percent at the 95 percent confidence level.

Where necessary, responses were weighted according to age, gender, and political party.
